

DIGITAL IDENTITIES AND DIGITAL FOOTPRINTS: THE FUTURE BECKONS



It is that time of the year when we take a stock of where exactly we stand. 2022 has just ended and 2023 is here with novel possibilities. There could not have been a more opportune moment to analyze life the way it is now in general and one aspect of our lives in particular. However, it is critically important to set the context first before getting down into the core issue.

The world has undergone a technological revolution in the past two decades. The ushering in of the online media has transformed human life. Information, thus, has become the contemporary currency. While nobody really talks about it directly, one of the areas that has been impacted is the creation of individual identities. Confused? Well, I do not blame you. Let us understand what it means.

When we use the word 'identity', we mean a set of unique and documented parameters that help us recognize an individual. The identity of one individual differentiates her/ him from someone else. Until the beginning of the current millennium, the identity of an individual was recorded on physical files (usually official) and that was enough to establish her/ his recognizability. Not anymore! Today, in addition to official records, a person is being increasingly identified through her/ his virtual presence. As one can understand, one part of it is through social media. The likes of *Instagram*, *Twitter*, *LinkedIn*, and *Facebook* record the virtual identity of a person so much so that sometimes those become the tools to trace her/ him. The other part of the virtual identity that we are talking about is created through the scores of online forms and online records that we all fill up daily without even blinking an eye.

Let us further understand the issue at hand. You order a Farmhouse Pizza through an online food delivery platform like *Zomato*, and your identity is recorded on the platform. You go online and search a hotel for a trip that you are about to undertake through *Google* search that you have already signed in, your identity is recorded. While I can go on giving more examples, the list is endless, and I am sure you get the drift of the discussion. Many of us are naïve enough to believe that the records can be deleted by deleting the sign-in data. Well, it is not that easy. The footprints stay on for eternity. Even dead people have their digital footprints on the web. It might seem a little dystopic. However, anybody can ascertain the veracity of what we are currently discussing.

The creation of virtual or digital identities and the inevitability of it is only the first part of the story. The second and most important part of the story is the care with which we should curate our digital identities. Just as it is a pre-requisite to keep a clean social image to garner greater social mileage, it is equally important to maintain a clean online or virtual image to garner greater online mileage.

Starting from how recruiters verify our credentials to getting a visa for another country, our digital identities have come to define who we are and what we ideologically and professionally represent. While one might scoff at the entire phenomenon as a hoax, there is no escape from it. As *Metaverse* becomes a roaring reality, the importance of our digital identities is only going to enhance.

Therefore, be incredibly careful before posting that casual personal threat to someone on your *Facebook* wall. You might have done it just for fun. However, that single activity might be reason enough for your student's visa for the United States of America (USA) to be rejected. Make sure that you build your credibility on the digital platform just as carefully as you would build your real-life social credibility.

10th Convocation



THE 10TH CONVOCATION PANDIT DEENDAYAL ENERGY UNIVERSITY, GANDHINAGAR

22 November 2022: India's two industry stalwarts have highlighted the growing need for energy across the globe and underlined the imperative shift towards the green and clean type. Speaking at the 10th convocation of Pandit Deendayal Energy University at Gandhinagar on Tuesday evening the Chairman of Tata Sons, Mr N Chandrasekaran, and Reliance Industry Chairman and PDEU President, Dr Mukesh Ambani, exhorted the younger generation to be ready for the great opportunities that India is offering them by being bold and have a dream and purpose to chase.



Pointing to the robust Indian economy that is to grow from about \$ 3.5 trillion to several trillion dollors in the next few years, Mr Chandrasekaran said the youth of today were standing at the cusp of something special. As they witness tremendous growth and development, they have to forge a new world, a new India, he said.







Congratulating the graduating students, their parents and their faculty for their collective achievements, Mr Chandrasekaran spoke about the development in science and technology and highlighted how the development that was to take place in the next 10 years was to be far greater than the progress made in the last 100 years. The pace of change in the energy and technology sectors is so great, he said.





Mr Chandrasekaran also focused on India's role in the sustainable development of the world and claimed India was at the cusp of new transitions. He asserted that the current generation was to witness tremendous advancement in the quality of life. He summed up by encouraging the students to continue to learn, and gain knowledge throughout their lives and wished them all successful careers.

Mr Chandrasekaran and other dignitaries at the convocation included the PDEU President Dr Mukesh Ambani (online), PDEU Standing Committee Chairman, Dr Hasmukh Adhia (IAS, retd), PDEU Director General, Prof (Dr) S Sundar Manoharan. They handed over degree certificates to 1659 graduating students which included 101 merit medal winners. Several senior academics and IAS officers, industry leaders and prominent citizens graced the occasion to make the day memorable to the graduating students and their families.



Dr Ambani in his address aksed the graduating students to make the most of the Amrit Kaal that India had entered into. "As the Amrit Kaal unfolds, India will witness an unprecedented explosion in economic growth and opportunities. From a \$ 3- trillion economy, India will grow to become a \$ 40-trillion economy by 2047, ranking among the top three economies of the world in your working life. In other words, a bright future beckons you. Be ready to step out confidently when opportunity knocks on your door," he said.

"In our tradition, Amrit Kaal is regarded as the most auspicious time to start anything new. And each of you are starting your professional journey in this period." He added.

Dr Ambani told the graduating students that PDEU had made them future-ready, because it researches and teaches energy with a very comprehensive perspective.

Three game-changing revolutions will govern India's growth in the decades ahead, he said and named them: The Clean Energy Revolution, the Bio-Energy Revolution and the Digital Revolution.

"Together, they will transform lives in ways unimagined. While the Clean Energy Revolution and the Bio-Energy Revolution will produce energy sustainably, the Digital Revolution will enable us to consume energy efficiently. All three revolutions will together help India and the world save our beautiful planet from the Climate Crisis," he said.

Dr Ambani also reminded them of the sacrifices their parents have made for them and the expectation society and the nation have from the younger generation.

Earlier, welcoming all stakeholders, the Director Genaral, Prof (Dr) S Sundar Manoharan recalled how this graduating batch witnessed several unique landmarks. "We started this year with PDEU being recognized by the Government of Gujarat as the Center of Excellence. As we come to the end of this year, we received a unique distinction as declared by the National Assessment and Accreditation COUNCIL (NAAC), with the highest grade, A++. We deeply thank all our stakeholders and particularly, our President Dr. Mukesh Ambani who has been the force behind this transformative journey."

Dr Manoharan also acknowledged the contribution, support and grants received from the Government of Gujarat in helping the university in its new mandate as Energy University. Dr. Ritu Sharma, Dean of Faculty of Liberal Studies anchored the programme. The convocation was also webcast live on its website and social media platforms.


















Key Events of SLS

This session was on joint research collaborations and funding opportunities for the School of Liberal Studies (SLS) under Pandit Deendayal Energy University (PDEU). Dr. Nigam Dave, Director of SLS, inaugurated the program, and the ending note was given by Prof. Ritu Sharma, Dean of SLS.

SLS invited faculty members and delegates from Rashtriya Raksha University, Dr. BR Ambedkar Open University, Central University of Gujarat, Ganpat University, and Gujarat National Law University. Faculty members from SLS also attended this event. A total number of 30 students also attended the session.

Dr. Kumar gave all the details related to the internships and made them aware of the application procedure to get the internship.

POSITIONING PUBLIC SERVICE DELIVERY

09 November, 2022: Prof. Nirmala Dorasamy, Faculty of Public Management and Economics, Durban University, South Africa gave an expert lecture on 'Positioning of Public Service Delivery' to students of the School of Liberal Studies (SLS) under Pandit Deendayal Energy University (PDEU).

Her visit was in coordination with the Public Administration Area under the Department of Social Science in SLS, PDEU. From the get-go, she took an informal tone – which helped to see as many of the 60 students who were seeing or hearing her for the first time. With a formal barrier out of the way, she started a simple interactive session which beautifully turned into a whole discourse on positioning public policy correctly.


To break into the exact topic of public service delivery, she asked students about the basic tenets of good governance – something which every Public Administration student would know. She used these tenets to detail and explain the need for every "good governance" instance to have three main aspects – demonstration of competence, demonstration of reliability, and demonstration of honesty.

Following this, a further discussion took place on describing the important components which could bring about competence, reliability, and honesty to induce good governance. These included examples from South Africa and comparative instances of India. She talked a lot about the disproportionate demand for welfare and the supply of the funds for the same. Likewise, the quality of frontline implementation and examples of corruption were introduced. This allowed shifting gears to public trust and confidence in the government machinery.

From there, the session was turned to ensuring the sustainability of public service delivery schemes allowing larger welfare in longer timelines. The regulation of PSDs and their advantages were discussed. Some actions like global partnerships and tightening procurement norms have decreased the prevalent corruption in a country due to increased collaborative opportunities and acceptance of best practices. In the end, after she introduced the methods of bridging gaps between people and government, she left students with an interesting thought as to if only having such mechanisms in place was enough, or was their effectiveness and efficiency monitoring equally as important!

A long-term professor, Prof. Dorasamy has had regular publications in several established journals. In addition to this, Professor Dorasamy has also been involved with the South African Government at the ground level towards policy formulation, implementation, and eradication of corruption. She has also acted as the editor of History Magazine at Durban Technological University. Her work in organizing various programs and activities at various levels has been commendable. A WORKSHOP ON QUALITATIVE AND QUANTITATIVE RESEARCH METHODOLOGY

10 November, 2022: Prof. Nirmala Dorasamy, Faculty of Public Management and Economics, Durban University, South Africa gave an expert lecture on 'Qualitative and Quantitative Research Methodology' to students of PDEU. The lecture was attended by eighty students. With most students knowing her, the participants were at instant ease and an interactive introduction to the topic took place. The topic was broken down into sub-aspects like problem finding, hypotheses, evidence, and comparative analyses with other worldwide resources.

The professor used a straightforward example throughout the class about: 'Employee Turnover in Higher Education Universities in South Africa'. She explained using a reference to 'Peeling of the Onion' by Saunders. Using the example she mentioned above, she described most research aspects in simplified terminology. She explained the outline of moving from finding a problem to its whole analysis via research and observation and navigating towards an interpretation for further comments, suggestions, and recommendations to the problem identified. This took the conversation to find the correct and case-appropriate method of finding the observation and stakeholder research in order to better analyze and solve an issue.

With that conversation, the discussion turned to the core of the event:discussing qualitative and quantitative methods of research. With basic introductions about both methods using real-life examples, Prof. Nirmala moved to the characteristics of qualitative research and its subjective nature. Post this, the objective nature and specific characteristics of quantitative research were explained. Focus further narrowed to the importance of small details which would make specific research more acceptable like removing biases via self-reflection and forming appropriate questionnaires utilizing ethical and best practices for unbiased and whole research.

The session concluded with questions from a couple of students. This was the last day of the professor visiting PDEU for expert lectures. The students left the venue better prepared for their academic journeys and armed with insights from one of the very accomplished researchers of this time.

Prof. Dorasamy's visit to PDEU is in coordination with the Area of Public Administration in the School of Liberal Studies, PDEU. POCSO ACT AWARENESS CAMPAIGN REPORT

14 November, 2022: Area of Public Policy and Administration, Department of Social Sciences, SLS, PDEU organized an awareness campaign on the POCSO Act – Protection of Children from Sexual Offences Act 2012, under the guidance of faculty coordinator Dr. Sriram Divi and in the presence of Dr. Nigam Dave, Director SLS, and Dr. Ritu Sharma, Dean SLS.

The students of BA/BBA Hons. Semester 3 pursuing the elective of Introduction to Law and Governance engaged themselves in an awareness drive on child sexual abuse and the legal system to protect children victims against such heinous crimes. 50 students of Law and Governance prepared at least 5 Instagram posts, posted stories, and shared information regarding child sexual abuse and POCSO Act across their social groups through social media. They were also able to spread the same across 1000 WhatsApp groups and 500+ social media handles.

It also encouraged people to watch the short film 'Komal' curated by Childline India and make their children watch it too. 'Komal' made it easy and inevitable for people to understand the gravity of child sexual abuse and the significance of a legal mechanism like the POCSO Act 2012 to protect children against it.

The students then took pictures and screenshots of the responses they received across various social media handles and pasted them on a poster. The posters were showcased to the faculties and students of SLS.

On November 14, 2022, on account of Children's Day, everyone celebrated 10 years of enforcement of the POCSO Act – Protection of Children from Sexual Offences Act 2012. Flyers and pamphlets regarding the same were designed by students. 350 flyers have been distributed by the students of Law and Governance among faculties and students of all schools of PDEU – SLS, SPM (SEM), SPT (SET), and SOT, and to the administrative faculties and staff members.

Through this entire awareness drive, they threw light on the rising cases of child sexual abuse, broke myths associated with it, and emphasized the need and significance of the POCSO Act. It encouraged people to raise their voices, report complaints if they've faced it or been a witness to any, and spread awareness to safeguard children's future because of #NoSilenceAgainstViolence.









MAHILA POLICE STATION VISIT REPORT

15 November, 2022: Area of Public Policy and Administration, Department of Social Sciences, SLS, PDEU organized a field visit to the Shahibaug Mahila Police Station for the students of BA/BBA Semester 3 pursuing an elective of Introduction to Law and Governance. It was facilitated by the course coordinator Dr. Sriram Divi.

Twenty students, along with Dr. Sriram Divi, left for the police station at 10.45 am on November 15, 2022, through bus transportation provided by the college. They reached the police station at around 11.15 am and were greeted by the Police Inspector.

After a brief conversation between PI sir and Dr. Sriram sir, PI sir asked students to stand in rows of 5 and began his interaction. He discussed the working of the Mahila Police Station, the difference between the general police station and Mahila police station, the types of cases registered with the police station, the method to solve those cases, the environment of the station, etc. He also informed us that the staff in the Mahila Police Station consists of 90% female officers and mostly dress in civil clothes except for two days to make women complainants feel comfortable.

He mentioned that the maximum number of cases of POCSO would get registered, and the victims would be 14-17-year-old girls in the nearby rural and slum areas who are considered soft targets by the perpetrators. He further said that counseling victims are a significant and differentiating factor of Mahila Police Stations.

Students got acquainted with the two units that come under the jurisdiction of Shahibaug Mahila Police Station: IUCAW – Investigation Unit for Crimes Against Women, which provides counseling and compensation to rape and gang-rape victims and acts as a medium between victims and government, and AHTU – Anti-Human Trafficking Unit which tracks human traffickers and brings back child victims safely to their parents. A discussion on the presence of the SHE team also took place.

The visit got concluded by presenting PI sir with a shawl as a token of love and respect and Pictures were taken with the entire team at Shahibaug Mahila Police Station.











EXPERT LECTURE ON FORENSIC PSYCHOLOGY

The session was organized with the help of the Aatmann club (Psychology Club of PDEU) which helped in the smooth coordination of the session. To give students exposure to Forensic Psychology and to make them aware of this emerging area, Dr. Prashanto Saha, Assistant Professor, NFSU was invited to deliver an expert lecture on Forensic Psychology. Kanan Pathak (M.A. Sem1) gave a warm welcome to the expert and introduce him to the audience.

During the session, students learned how forensic science works in crime and in studying criminal behavior. He explained the role of forensic psychology in the investigation of a crime. He also talked about some advanced investigative techniques like Polygraph, Narco Test, and BEOS. Dr. Saha shared some very interesting cases he encountered. This session helped students to understand many unknown facts of the crime and how forensics psychology will be one of the major fields to work in and will grow even more in the coming future. Sir was generous enough to take his time out for the students. He also cleared all the doubts and blocks related to forensic psychology. At the end of the session, Dr. Shraddha Sharma gave a vote of thanks and concluded the event.



























GUEST LECTURE ON INDUSTRY 4.0 INSIGHTS INTO WORKPLACE COMMUNICATION

Around 192 students attended the session. The Objective of the lecture was to sensitize the students to develop Effective Professional communication skills that meet the ever-changing needs of the global marketplace. To expose the students to the actual workspace/work culture communication styles and expectations of the corporate world and to open new opportunities for Industry-Academia Collaborations and Internship.

The resource person - Khushru F. Doctor, the founder of Taasha Tech Info Solutions Pvt. Ltd. (Software Development and testing), shared his corporate experience and journey with an emphasis on communication. He talked about Industry 4.0 expectations from the applicants. He cited examples of bad/poor communication and its impact on business and individual and organizational success from his corporate experience to give students real Industry experience. He further elaborated and enriched his talk by providing insights into the expectations of the global market from the applicants and also shared with the students how they can work or prepare themselves as Global Industry Ready personals. PSYCHOLOGICAL DISORDERS: A LONG ROAD TO COVER



19 November 2022: The School of Liberal Studies organized a four-hour expert lecture on November 19, 2022, for M.A. (Psychology) Semester 3 students and B.A. (Psychology Major) 5 Semester students. This session was coordinated by Dr. Ritu Sharma, Dean SLS, PDEU and co-coordinated by Dr. Shraddha Sharma (Faculty, Psychology). To touch on the practical aspects of Personality Disorders and Sexual Disorders, Dr. Surbhi Joshi, Consultant Psychiatrist, GIPS, Ahmedabad visited SLS, PDEU, Liza Abadan (M.A. Semester 3 student) greeted the expert and introduced her.

The lecture was conducted in two sessions. The first session began at 10:30 am and personality disorders were covered in this session. The session began with a general discussion on DSM-5, then she discussed the clinical description of Personality Disorders including A, B, and C clusters and their causes. She also discussed some interesting cases of these disorders and asked students to suggest treatments. The first session was concluded in 2.5 hours.

In the second session, sexual disorders were discussed. She told students that sexual disorders are the most ignored disorders in Psychiatry as well as in Psychology. She spoke about Paraphilia and sexual dysfunction in males and females. She gave a detailed clinical description of these disorders and suggested possible ways to deal with such problems. She also discussed the case of a young boy with a sexual disorder.

Toward the end of the session, questions and queries were raised by students. Students also asked about internship opportunities, visits to psychiatry wards, and about indoor psychiatry patients. Dr. Shraddha Sharma gave the vote of thanks and concluded the events.














AUDIT COURSE EXPOSURE TO NCC BATCH 2022-2026

The School of Liberal Studies (SLS) offers an Audit course, especially for its first-year students. The course is a step toward one of the main objectives of SLSs: enhancing a student's creative thinking and fostering a scholarly teaching and learning culture based on reflective and creative independence. With the utmost discipline and confidence, along with the guidance of the respected faculty members, the Audit Team and Mentors running the Audit Course and EXPOSURE TO NCC sessions.

Session Report:

FIREFIGHTING AND DISASTER MANAGEMENT

The School of Liberal Studies offers an Audit Course program for its first-year students, for which a session on Fire Fighting and Disaster Management was conducted. The 2022 batch was divided into two groups, and the session took place on November 12, 2022, and November 13, 2022, for both groups, respectively. The session was held and managed by the Audit Team.

The session was commenced by Mr. Manish Desai and his team from the Indian Institute of Fire & Safety, affiliated with the All India Institute of Fire Technology & Safety Management (AIIFTSM). It is an autonomous institute established for vocational education and skill development in Fire Technology and Safety Management courses. They also received assistance from the PDEU fire safety team.

Around 250+ students attended the session and were introduced to the basic firefighting equipment used in case of fire. The hosts gave information on different types of fire extinguishers that are used in different types of fires. In the theory session, students were informed about two types of disasters. They also stated how the government is taking measures to acknowledge people to be more cautious and teach them how to stay calm and handle hazardous situations.

In the second half, the students had a practical session where they learned different techniques used by firefighters to save victims who were affected by the fire. Later they practiced different knots firefighters used to make a stretcher or a chair to carry the victim. Afterward, the host guided the students about correctly using the fire extinguishers and made them aware of the dos and don'ts.

Students gave an exam about what they learned from the fruitful session and were awarded a certificate for their performance on the test. The session ended, and students were happy that they got to learn something new and different, which is important as well.

Al Replacing Grandparents Relies More On Universal Content: Study

Ahmedabad: As families become more nuclear in India and elsewhere, the ritual of a narrating bedtime story to children is now often assigned to artificial intelligence (AI)-based smart speakers. What happens when these speakers are asked to tell a story/ bedtime story or sing a rhyme?

The experiment formed a crux of a research currently going on at School of Liberal Studies (SLS) of Pandit Deendayal Energy University (PDEU). The research by Shrishti Kushwah, 'Future of



CHILDREN'S DAY

Children's Literature in the Cyber-Physical World' aims at understanding the outcomes of simple commands and future of children stories in the digital world with Artificial Intelligence (AI) and Augmented Reality (AR). As India celebrates Children's Day on November 14, the researchers said that the dynamics of how children get exposed to stories in their formative years is changing fast due to technology.

The result with Alexa, Siri and Cortana indicated that the AI chose an Akbar-Birbal story on its own for bedtime story, a moral story 'You've got to be kidding me' for a 'story' and 'Humpty-Dumpty Had a Great Fall' for a rhyme. The experiment was repeated multiple times with varying results.

hat remained constant during our experiment was the set range of stories such as Akbar-Birbal and Tarzan based on the geographic location detected by the device along with the age group of the listener. If the experiment is carried out somewhere else, the result may vary," said Prof Nigam Dave, director of SLS and guide to Kushwah.

Prof Nigam Dave, director of SLS said that many took to the digital devices both in terms of smart speakers and smartphones especially during the lockdown period and later where children were holed up at home and needed stimuli. "The trend has caught up, and one of the services has recent ly announced that the voice would imitate grandparents for that connect-it can be seen as an impact of the families going smaller and thus the task of bedtime story falling on these smart devices with seemingly unending supply of narratives, he said.

The researchers said that it's a bit early to say whether the trend is helpful. The research has taken into consideration several AI devices along with some known smart ro-

make-believe world," said Prof Dave.

"We found that children today are spending more time with digital devices. Dazzling visuals appeal to them and it's not stopping at two-dimensional visualization. Augmented Reality (AR) is fast adopted by many books to bring the sound and visuals of birds, animals, etc. alive while reading a story. We are witnessing a combination of mobile phones and books for the same," said Kushwah.




