# UGC'S PROFESSOR OF PRACTICE: THE MOST IMPORTANT PUSH TO HIGHER EDUCATION



Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) often face an existential challenge when it comes to vocational or practice-based programmes such as engineering, media, business administration, law, and the like. Academicians who fulfill the basic criteria of being selected as faculty members in these disciplines often lack industrial proficiency. While these academicians are otherwise accomplished and are experts in their own rights, they are invariably disconnected with the current trends in the industry. Most of the time, these academicians are recruited for their research acumen in theoretical aspects. This in turn impacts the industry readiness of the students. Thus, a healthy blend of academic and industrial acumen among the faculty members of a HEI is almost a compulsion in this era of Artificial Intelligence (AI) and technological cataclysm. This is precisely the reason why the

University Grants Commission (UGC) has come up with a master plan – the concept of *Professor of Practice*. Let us delve a little deeper into what this concept translates to.

The term *Professor of Practice* means just that – a professor who has been hired by a HEI subject to his significant contributions in her/ their/ his chosen field. All the stringent academic guidelines that are otherwise followed while recruiting regular faculty members are relaxed while recruiting a *Professor of Practice*. A compulsory *Doctor of Philosophy* (PhD) degree, journal publications, and prior teaching experience are not considered mandatory while employing a *Professor of Practice*.

Does it however mean that the empanelment of *Professors of Practice* is random and arbitrary, and it depends on the whims of the recruitment board? Of course not! The UGC has issued specific guidelines vis-à-vis the selection of *Professors of Practice* so that quality is ensured in the process. Let us look at some of the prominent guidelines:

- 1. Only those people will be eligible for recruitment as *Professors of Practice* who are 'distinguished experts' in their chosen fields. Also, they must have made 'significant contributions' to the overall development of their respective professions.
- 2. One needs to have at least 15 years of experience in her/ their/ his field of work ideally at a senior position.
- 3. The position of a *Professor of Practice* is not a permanent one. One can be employed as a *Professor of Practice* for a period not exceeding four years.
- 4. At any given point in time, the total number of *Professors of Practice* at a HEI cannot top 10 per cent of the total number of sanctioned faculty posts.



- 5. While at times, the HEI funds the position of a *Professor of Practice*, at other times, the position can be industry-funded as well.
- 6. However, an existing or a retired teacher cannot apply for the post of a *Professor of Practice*.

Universities and other HEIs across the board have latched onto this opportunity to rope in distinguished professionals from various vocational disciplines. While academic rigour and theoretical research studies are critically important to take a discipline to the next logical level, it is also important to teach students the skills to cope with the demands of the industry.

It has been seen that Indian HEIs have not been too successful in bridging the gap between the industry and the academia. Many a time, students from vocational disciplines have had to relinquish everything they learnt during their days at the college and the university when they entered the industry thus making skilling the responsibility of the recruiting organization. This has led to the industry being a little apprehensive about the final products churned out by the HEIs in India. The introduction of the concept of *Professor of Practice* would significantly address this problem and many others. Let us wait and see how the panorama shapes up in the next few years.

# WORKSHOP REPORT: ESSENTIALS IN MATHEMATICS AND STATISTICS




The session concluded with group exercises on the theme and with a question and answer round.

#### SEMINAR ON 'PUBLIC RELATIONS AND CSR IN BANKING'

October 3, 2023: The Mass Communication Area of the Department of Languages, Literature, and Aesthetics organised an educational seminar on 'Public Relations and CSR in the Banking Sector.' The seminar was delivered by Mr. Pranav Trivedi, an author, retired banker, and freelance journalist. Mr. Trivedi, who served in the State Bank of India as a Public Relations Officer, brought with him the experience of a banking career spanning 38 years. The event was organized by Dr. Amrita Chakraborty, Assistant Professor of Mass Communication in the School of Liberal Studies.



At the onset, he conducted an engaging ice-breaking session that worked wonders in creating a positive atmosphere by facilitating interactions, in which the attendees shared their career goals and hobbies. To gradually focus attention on the agenda, Mr. Trivedi then asked the students about their experiences with banks. After a few light-hearted anecdotes, the session delved deep into the nuances of public relations and CSR efforts by banks. When the speaker explained exactly why and how banks do what they do in terms of maintaining relationships, the students were able to grasp an understanding of the big picture. They realised that even the smallest initiatives are the fruit of laborious planning and implementation, ultimately serving the purpose of strengthening the communication cycle of a bank.



Following this discussion, Mr. Trivedi highlighted the significance of Public Relations in banks. From handling media coverage to conducting market research and appraising top management for analysis, Public Relations plays a vital role every step of the way. He also briefed the attendees about how a good PR strategy works and the characteristics it should entail. The lecture underlined important features like a signature of the bank, connection with the market, strong brand value, and trust quotient.



Moving ahead, the seminar covered the practical aspect of Public Relations in the form of a group exercise. The students were divided into groups of 5, and each group was handed a chit that carried the name of a fictitious organisation. The task was to create a public relations strategy for the assigned organisation and present it before all the other participants. The session then witnessed an excited murmur of students brainstorming and penning ideas. Subsequently, Mr. Trivedi patiently heard the strategies made by the students. The room was brimming with innovative viewpoints put forward by each group. The lecture concluded with insightful suggestions by Mr. Trivedi about things that should be taken special care of while drafting a PR strategy. He also gave collective feedback for the task performed by the students and appreciated their efforts and acumen.

Dr. Amrita Chakraborty closed the seminar by presenting Mr. Pranav Trivedi with a token of gratitude. The service-based banking industry plainly depends on the quality of communication for smooth operations. Public Relations is indeed a key factor in strengthening this quality through thoughtful research, planning, implementation, and evaluation.







### TWO-DAY RESEARCH METHODOLOGY WORKSHOP

### **Day 1**

#### **Session 1:**

Dr. Niti Mehta is a Professor of Economics, directing the Sardar Patel Institute of Economic and Social Research, Ahmedabad. An alumnus of Delhi School of Economics, CEPT University, and Gujarat University, her research is focused on agriculture development, employment, agricultural growth and rural transformation, urbanization, and related areas. Prof Mehta has authored several research papers on these subjects. Dr. Niti Mehta's session was from 10 am to 11:30 am where she talked about the importance of research in social sciences and its relevance. Research helps in formulating new policies, understanding the inequalities existing in society, and challenges faced by women, children, and senior citizens.

#### **Session 2:**

Dr. Manoj Sahoo was the resource person for this session. Dr. Sahoo has been a visiting professor of economics at PDEU for the past 10 years. Dr. Sahoo's session was on sampling techniques and methods of data collection. He started his session with brief background definitions of research. Then he went on to talk about the sources of data collection like, primary and secondary. Further, he spoke about the sample representing the population and how it should mirror it. He simplified the concepts which helped us better understand sampling and its related techniques.

#### **Session 3:**

Prof. Pradeep Mallik was the resource person for this session. Prof. Mallik is HoD and professor SLS, PDEU. He is a communication teacher with three decades of experience in print, broadcast, and new media. He talked about research problems and quantitative and qualitative analyses. A problem arises when things don't go as expected. He talked about identifying research gaps with the help of a proper literature review of past papers in the targeted field. He gave us a situation where he asked us to create a research problem.

#### **Session 4:**

Dr. Nausheen Nizami was the resource person for this session. She is an associate professor of economics, at SLS, PDEU. Dr. Nizami talked about the various methods of data collection. She then talked about preparing, importing, processing, and storing data. She also talked about coding data in which she taught us two types of coding: deductive and inductive.

### <u>Day 2</u>

#### Session 1:

Dr. Vaibhav Shah took the first session. Dr. Vaibhav Shah is an associate professor of English, SLS, PDEU. Dr. Shah talked about ethics in research, research outcomes, and the scope of publication. He started the session by talking about understanding the relevance of individual research through Peer review, Research Guide, and Scholars who know that particular field. He then talked about Ethics that need to be followed while conducting research like being Honest, keeping Confidentiality, Objectivity, Briefing participants about the research, etc. The Outcomes of the research should be accepted by the researcher and should not be manipulated. He also talked about the various academic journals on which the research papers can be uploaded by the researcher to make his/her research more credible and available for further use in the respected field.

#### **Session 2:**

Dr. Ritu Sharma was the resource person for this session. Dr. Sharma is the Dean of SLS, PDEU. Dr. Sharma talked about the format of research writing. She started by telling us how research is an amalgamation of new knowledge backed by a good literature review. She shared the format of dissertation writing, establishing the importance of your topic, delineating the possible future of the research, analyzing the gap in research and working to overcome the gap, stating the aim of your study and its relevance, citing the work done by specific writers, comparing results with previous papers, outlining undesired or unexpected results and admitting the limitations/setbacks of the outcome.

#### **Sessions 3 and 4:**

These sessions were taken by the respective department's subject experts related to their respective subject areas. They guided the students on topic selection and research methodology necessary for their departments and cleared all doubts.



The discussion underscored the importance of early preparation, not only to enhance examination scores but also to provide students with a broader range of options and increase their chances of securing scholarships. The interactive session offered students valuable insights and diverse perspectives to help them navigate their educational objectives.

The seminar's success was evident in the engaging Q&A session that followed, where participants actively discussed and sought clarification on various aspects of international higher education. The event concluded with a heartfelt vote of thanks from the organisers, expressing gratitude to the attendees and Mr. Chandramauli Bhatt for their active participation and contributions.


# PDEUના સ્ટુડન્ટ્સ દ્વારા સ્કિલ ડેવલોપમેન્ટ પ્રોગ્રામ


