# TRANSDISCIPLINARITY: ALLOWING STUDENTS TO PURSUE TWO DEGREE PROGRAMMES SIMULTANEOUSLY A STEP IN THE RIGHT DIRECTION



When it comes to Indian higher education, one thing that had always been missing is flexibility – flexibility in terms of selecting subjects, flexibility in terms of multitasking and most importantly flexibility in following the heart. While overseas universities always provided the leeway for students to follow their hearts, the Indian educational system followed a regimented structure. Consequently, progressive academic concepts such as innovation, creativity, lifelong learning, meaningful entrepreneurship and experimentation were scoffed at. Conformity to the notorious Macaulayism introduced during the British era ensured that students across the country were still following the archaic British educational model. This model has long been discarded by the very country that introduced it – United Kingdom. Therefore, the focus of the educational system was to create parrots, who could only do mundane process-oriented and repetitive jobs.

The educational wheel, though, started to rotate in the correct direction with the introduction of the *National Education Policy 2020* (NEP 2020). It provided students the freedom to read physics with psychology or philosophy with mathematics. Unheard of and unthinkable until the other day, liberal education was thankfully given its rightful place in the academic structure. Thus, it was only expected that a few more progressive moves would be announced to declare that India has indeed arrived in terms of higher education.

Just a few days back, the *University Grants Commission* (UGC), which regulates higher education in India, announced that a student would be able to pursue two different full-time degree programmes at the same time. Additionally, it was also announced she/ he can pursue the two programmes from either the same university or two different universities.

With the onset of full-fledged online education, spurred by the global Covid-19 pandemic, multiple universities in India have come up with complete only degree programmes. Therefore, a student has the leeway to either go for two physical programmes or do a combination of one physical programme and one online programme or even opt for two online programmes. This step is set to be a gamechanger. Let us look at how this masterstroke by the UGC will help the Indian students:

1. With the professional world preferring multiskilled employees and multitasking becoming the new normal, students need to equip themselves with more than one skill. This step of allowing one to pursue two different programmes has the potential to go a long way in enhancing the professional acumen of Indian students, who have been often found wanting in different respects when it comes to the global academic standards.

- 2. Innovation and creativity are the twin contemporary buzzwords. With *Artificial Intelligence* (AI), *Machine Learning* (ML) and the *Internet of Things* (IoT) slowly but surely taking charge of the clerical jobs, the survival of a professional would depend largely on her/ his ability to solve problems. Innovation and creativity come handy exactly at these points. The pursuance of two degrees would significantly broaden the thinking horizon of a student and thereby make her/ him a problem solver.
- 3. Problems in life do not usually come in packets. Problems, often, are multidimensional and multipronged. Therefore, the solutions also need to be multidimensional and multipronged. Any professional needs to know all the nuances of a problem to effectively solve it. This is where the pursuance of two degrees can have a momentous impact on professionalism. Two different degrees impart two different approaches to a student, and therefore, she/ he becomes much more equipped to face the real-world challenges.
- 4. Last but not the least, a student might have the tenacity to pursue a degree programme just to quench her/ his thirst for enhanced knowledge. This UGC move would thus be an enabler in the said direction.


While the intentions are right, the eventual success of this move would depend more on the students and the teachers, who need to update and upgrade their own skills to be in tune with the demands of the time.







# Key Events of SLS



#### PUBLIC POLICY ACADEMIC ENRICHMENT PROGRAM

**7-18 Mar. 2022:** The Public Policy: Academic Enrichment Program was held from March 7-18, 2022, from 6 pm - 8 pm through the Zoom Meetings. . It was organized by the Department of Public Administration of School of Liberal Studies (SLS), Pandit Deendayal Energy University (PDEU), the Foundation of Community Consensus (FCC), and the Indian body of the Czech thinktank Institute H21. The Facilitator for the program was Ms. Ankitha Cheerakathil, the Executive Director of FCC, who conducted the program along with Expert Mentors.

Spread over the period of two weeks, the program covered a wide range of topics taken by Expert Mentors including Czech-India Relations, Problem Definition, Public Health, Municipal Finance, and Collective Intelligence. Mr. Filip Dufek, a Czech Ambassador in New Delhi, covered Czech-India Relations and also talked to the students about studying in the Czech Republic and Europe. Mr. Anirudh Dinesh, NYU GovLab's Research Fellow, taught the students about Problem Definition and its importance in finding actual solutions. Dr. Gajendra Singh, a Health Officer at UNICEF, talked to the students about Public Health, the health system in India, and COVID-19. Mr. Matthew Glasser, a former Consultant at World Bank and an expert in Municipal Finance and Administration, talked to the students about Municipal Finance, debt, and urban local bodies. Ms. Ankitha, the Chief Mentor, covered Collective Intelligence, its importance in a democracy, and real-life applications through participatory practices in governance.

The program also included a one-of-a-kind Simulation where the students experienced first-hand the concept of participatory practices in governance by engaging in live-action Participatory Budgeting. They were assigned roles to play in the imaginary town of Empaville, including identities, area of residence and work, basic financial background, characteristics, and attitude towards the entire concept. Downtown, Middletown, and Uptown all then came up with 1-2 proposals on how to use the assigned 10 lakhs for the benefit of the town.



The students came up with extremely interesting and highly thoughtful projects including a multipurpose hall with scheduled activities reducing the disparities between the residents, developing the stadium and creating employment, developing a water transportation system, and a collective intelligence app. The groups presented their proposals to the town, engaged in debates and discussions through the questions and answers session, and participated in the voting, where the collective intelligence app proposal by Uptown won.

The program also included two case studies, both derived from real-life situations. The first was based on education, covering quality education for the underprivileged and funding, and was reviewed by Ms. Ankitha. The second was based on health, covering the crisis the health sector faced at the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic and reviewed by Dr. Gajendra. The program ended with an insight into higher education and careers in governance and the policy sector by Ms. Ankitha who also shared an ideal path for interested students.

#### INTERACTIVE SESSION WITH AMBASSADOR DP SRIVASTAVA

**9 Mar. 2022:** The School of Liberal Studies (SLS) of Pandit Deendayal Energy University organized an interactive session with Ambassador D.P. Srivastava on March 9, 2022 on Energy Transition, Climate Change and Geopolitics.

Ambassador Srivastava started with a conceptual clarification of 'energy transition' that began in the 18th century during the coal age as he described. He said that it is urgent that the world should move away from fossil fuel now. Around 70% of the world's energy consumption comes from fossil fuel which can cause environmental instability in the near future. Beside other repercussions, as Ambassador Srivastava pointed out, the immediate impact of the ongoing Ukraine crisis will be on energy supply and cost which will ultimately affect geopolitics and climate change. He further highlighted the concept of Net Zero Emission, an initiative by the International Energy Agency, to remove man-made greenhouses from the atmosphere. Ambassador Srivastava expressed that the Net Zero Emission goal is a fallacy as the de-carbonization drive today largely depends on the pace of electricity generation and consumption which lacks adequate infrastructure at the moment. Therefore, before it is too late, a plan for massive expansion of nuclear energy infrastructure which is green and viable for the evolution of new reactor technology should be made according to Ambassador Srivastava. To conclude, it was an extremely insightful session.









#### GAME THEORY PERSPECTIVES ON DIGITAL MARKETS & ANTITRUST CASES

**15 Mar. 2022:** Bulls and Bears, the Finance Club of PDEU, in collaboration with The Economics Area, Department of Social Sciences at SLS organized an event on 'Game Theory Perspectives on 'Digital Markets & Antitrust Cases' with Prof. Dr. Viswanath Pingali, faculty, Economics Area, IIM Ahmedabad. The talk commenced at 2:00 PM and hosted more than 80 students from MA, BA, BBA, and B.Com streams across schools at PDEU.

Graced by Prof. Dr. Nigam Dave, Director of SLS, the talk covered a variety of topics ranging from a brief introduction to digital markets, direct and indirect network effects, strategies and policies of the digital markets, predatory prices, and antitrust cases. The event was made possible under the guidance of Prof. Dr. Nausheen Nizami and Ms. Reema Lucia along with a team of ten volunteers.





Prof. Pingali began with an introduction to the world of digital markets, economies of scale, and the virtuous cycle by quoting several examples from 'Elephants And Cheetahs: The Beauty of Operations' by Saral Mukherjee. He then discussed single and multi-home, global and local network effects, and 'the platform bubble' that exists in today's markets using case studies from Maruti, MRF, Windows, and Microsoft among others.

He concluded the talk by noting how data is the new strategy in digital markets and explaining the relevance of 'Stag Hunt' - which is a game that describes a conflict between safety and social cooperation. The event was brought to an end at 3:30 PM with a riveting question and answer session followed by a Vote of Thanks by Ms. Reema Lucia.

# ACADEMIC EXPOSURE VISIT TO VEDANCHA AND CHANDISAR VILLAGES IN BANASKANTHA DISTRICT, GUJARAT

**25 Mar. 2022:** A visit to Vedancha and Chandisar villages in Banaskantha District of Gujarat was organized by the area of Public Administration, Department of Social Sciences, SLS, PDEU on March 25, 2022, as a part of the Academic Exposure Program, which was coordinated by Dr. Venkat Ram Reddy and Dr. Sriram Divi. A group of 39 students from both bachelor's and master's programs was listed for the visit. Special acknowledgements to Shri Swapnil Khare, DDO, Banaskantha.

#### Vedancha Village:

The journey started from PDEU to Vedancha village in Palanpur taluka. At Vedancha, the students were greeted by the Sarpanch and the Government Officials of the village in the Panchayat office. The Sarpanch was a retired teacher who headed the development activity of the village. The Sarpanch took pride in sharing with the students that his village was going to be a model village soon because of water purifying plants and solid waste recycling plants constructed in their village. Mr. Dushyant - a solid waste consultant in the village was determined to generate a source of income from waste management in the village's developmental activities. Our faculty along with some of the students felicitated the Sarpanch and the Government officials with a memento.

Using technical support from UNICEF and PriMove, Vedancha village was able to set up the 'Grey Water Treatment Unit' which holds the capacity to purify 2 lakh liters of water daily, which can then be used for agricultural purposes. The villagers were very particular about using water as the village faced a shortage of rainwater. To resolve this issue, a pond was being constructed that will store rainwater and in it, a 700 feet deep bore-well is under construction too.

The students also saw the water distribution system of the village. It was a systematic method that was used to supply water to the nearby habitats through well-constructed pipelines. The residents received tap water through this method as per the scheduled time. The water-distribution timetable was drawn on the wall and a fixed time was allotted to each area.

For the collection of solid waste, a door-to-door facility of garbage collection was also provided that collected dry and wet waste separately. The wet waste would then go to the 'Resource Recovery Center' where it would be converted into compost, and the dry waste would go for secondary segregation. Similarly, the government official Mr. Dinesh gave the details about each and every innovation that he and his team had set up under the umbrella of 'Swachh Bharat Mission (Gramin)'.





#### Chandisar Village:

Chandisar was another village in the Palanpur Taluka. After gathering remarkable insights in Vedancha on how water and waste management could be done with minimum cost, the students explored another component of the administration which was e-governance. They visited the Gram Panchayat of Chandisar village, met their officials, and gathered information about their village. All of them were intrigued to find out how all their records were maintained systematically and digitally. When the students inquired about the financial inclusion of the people of the village, they came to know that the majority of the villagers had their Jan Dhan accounts and were direct beneficiaries of a number of Central and State Government schemes. Not just that, but the officials were technically educated, and through various Yojanas such as I-Khedut, E-ashram, and E-Gram, they enabled people of different professions to promote the culture of education and a standard job in an implicit manner. The Sarpanch of the Gram Panchayat was a lady, which shed light on how much importance was given to the education of girls and the empowerment of women.

The students then visited the Village Dairy wherein every day, 20,000 liters of milk (10,000 liters in the morning and 10,000 liters in the evening) was collected, processed, through cooling, and sent to the main Banas Dairy for further processing. Those who provided milk to the dairy got their income on the basis of the amount of fat in the milk they provided. It was impressive how the annual profits from the dairy of the village went to the farmers.

#### VIRTUAL-FIELD VISIT FOR URBAN DEVELOPMENT AND CITY GOVERNANCE

**28 Mar. 2022:** A unique experience where theories meet real-world implications was organized on March 28, 2022 by the Area of Public Administration and Policy through a virtual field visit. This virtual field visit was part of the Urban Development and City Governance Course. It was conducted through video conference mode, and officials/resource persons from Integrated Command and Control Center (ICCC) of Smart City Ahmedabad Development Ltd (SCADL), a special purpose vehicle (SPV) of Ahmedabad Municipal Corporation (AMC), coordinated it for BABBA and B.Com Elective (Semester II) students. The session was coordinated by the faculty of Area of Public Administration and Policy, Dr Anurag Srivastava, Dr D. Sriram and Dr Venkatram Reddy.

This was the first time ICCC, SCADL and PDEU provided such a unique virtual experience. This visit highlighted the insights into how technology plays a pivotal role in governance and the public service delivery aspect. The students were provided with an understanding of how real-time governance is being done through the ICT mechanism. As the course structure highlights various urban development schemes, thus an empirical apprehension on facets of Smart City Governance was distinguished by the officials of SCADL to our students.

ICCC is a platform, which through its different layers and components, acts as a decision support system for the Ahmedabad city administration to respond to the real-time events for 12 public services which includes water supply, sewerage, streetlight, e-challan, etc. Responses are given through:

- 1. Seamless integration between systems, sites, people and assets.
- 2. Improved operational efficiency.
- 3. Reduced energy cost.
- 4. Adherence to cybersecurity.

We share our gratitude to the Chief Administrative Officer (CEO) of SCADL, Shri. Praveen Chaudhary, who provided his extensive support in making this unique learning experience possible for our students. We are also thankful to Mr Ankit Patel (Assistant Manager) for taking us through the various aspects of real-time governance, public service delivery and urban development. Two hundred and seventy-two (272) students attended the virtual field visit from the B101 classroom of PDEU, including students from 2021-BABBA, 2021-B.COM and 2021-MA in Public Administration batches.

We are thankful to Dr Nigam Dave (Director, SLS) for his support and Dr Ritu Sharma (Dean, SLS) for her kind presence and for addressing the students during the virtual field visit. 

## 2 DAYS WORKSHOP – RESEARCH METHODS, STATISTICS AND RESEARCH WRITING

**28 & 29 Mar. 2022:** The School of Liberal Studies (SLS) under Pandit Deendayal Energy University conducted a workshop for the final year undergraduate and postgraduate students on research methods, statistics and research writing now on the 28th & 29th March 2022. The workshop was conceptualised and given a framework by Prof. Nigam Dave and Dr. Ritu Sharma. The faculty coordinators for the said workshop were Dr. Divi Sriram, Dr. Chaitanya Vyas and Dr. Sanjay Pradhan.

The motive of the workshop was to provide students with the knowledge of research methods, statistics and research writing and how it works to enhance the skills required to write their final year dissertations, which is a part of their course. 260 enthusiastic students attended the workshop.



The first workshop was held on March 28, 2022, from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. It started with the introduction to Research, Research Design and Sample Design by Prof Venkatraman of VNSGU. The second session was held on sampling fundamentals and data collection methods by Prof. Viral Pandya of Gujarat National Law University. Further, we had Prof. Pradeep Mallik taking a session on Research problems and the various quantitative and qualitative analysis techniques. The first day of the workshop came to an end with Prof. Ami Divatia, who took the last session of the day on Processing and Analysis of data and the methods of testing hypotheses.





The second day of the workshop was held on March 29, 2022, from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. It started with the introduction to the day by Prof. Nigam Dave and Dr. Divi Sriram. The first session was conducted on formulation, interpretation and research writing by Dr. Ritu Sharma. The second session was on ethics, research outcomes, and publication scope conducted by Prof. Pradeep Mallik. For the second half of the day, the students broke out into different sections depending on their chosen field. The sessions went on parallelly for Public Administration, English literature, Economics, Finance, International Relationship, Business Administration and Marketing, Mass Communication, and Psychology. During an online interaction Mr. Ticknor emphasised on the changing world order and the mutual trade interests between US and India.






#### A space for dialogue

16 Mar. 2022: The first Samvād talk of this semester was delivered by Dr. Niyati Shah who initiated a discussion 'Intermediality and the Autobiographical Construction of Self'. The talk explored the concept ofintermediality with reference to the autobiographical construction of the self. It examined how intermediality interacts as a performative mode in the process of constructing and representing the self. In this light, intermediality was studied in relation with performance, narration, and representation of the self as reflected in the self-narratives. These self-narratives further heighten the interaction between intermediality and autobiographical construction of the self when theatre artistes narrate themselves on page. Self-narratives of Indian theatre artists were used as primary texts in this talk. The talk was followed by an absorbing discussion on the key terms and texts brought out by Dr. Shah in her presentation.



#### **Decoupage Art**

#### What is Decoupage Art?

Decoupage is the art of decorating an object by gluing colored paper cutouts onto it in combination with special paint effects, gold leaf, and other decorative elements. Commonly, an object like a small box or an item of furniture is covered by cutouts from magazines or purpose-manufactured papers. There are many variations in the technique, but the four basic steps of decoupage generally are cutting out the pictures, arranging them to depict a scene or tell a story, pasting them on a surface, and applying several thin coats of varnish or lacquer to the pictures.

Two workshops on the topic of decoupage art were held on March 5 and 6, 2022, for groups 1-2 on Saturday and 3-4 on Sunday. The session was organized on an online portal where it was directed under the guidance of Seema Agrawal and managed by the Audit Team.

The decoupage session began with a theoretical presentation in which students learned about the artwork's origins, significance, and history. Students were also shown a variety of motifs to give them an idea of how the artwork could be created. In addition, the 21 batches were shown artwork from prior years, which provided a unique perspective. Following the theoretical session, a practical session took place where students were given a step-by-step explanation. Each student received an art kit that includes a printed tissue that they were required to utilize for their artwork. Personal guidance was provided to each student, and everyone was explained how they could use their respective kits to make a unique design. Constant help and supervision were available at all times. All the art pieces turned out to be beautiful, and each student was delighted to learn about a new art form. The session was conducted cordially, and it turned out to be quite interesting and educational. The session ended with capturing some beautiful photographs of the artworks made by the students, filling out the feedback forms, and submission of the artwork.







#### **WARLIART**

#### What is Warli Art?

The Warli art is an indigenous tribe of western India, living in mountainous as well as coastal areas along the Maharashtra-Gujarat border and surrounding areas. They have their own animistic beliefs, life, customs, and traditions, and as a result of acculturation, they have adopted many Hindu beliefs. The Warli paintings are done on mud walls with white paste. This white paste is a mixture of rice paste and water with gum as a binding. They use a bamboo stick chewed at the end to make it as supple as a paintbrush. The symbolism in Warli art represents the circle of life. The triangle symbolizes mountains and trees. The square indicates a sacred enclosure for the mother goddess, symbolizing fertility, while the circle represents the sun and the moon.

#### Session

For the class of 2021, two sessions on the topic "Warli Art" were organized. The sessions took place on February 12, 2022 for the students from groups 1-2 and on February 13, 2022, for the students from groups 3-4. The session was commenced by Seema Agrawal and managed by the volunteers of the Audit Team and it drew almost 150 students.

The session began with a theoretical presentation where the students were briefed about the importance, origin, and uses of Warli art in ancient times. They were also taught diverse types of designs that they can do on their bags. The volunteers of the Audit Team also showed their artwork which gave the students of the 21 batch a clearer idea and also encouraged them to perform with utmost enthusiasm. Followed by that, the practical session began where the students learned to make their designs on the cloth bag provided to them. After the lunch break, the session was resumed. Later designs were approved and suggestions were given wherever the students faced any difficulties. By the end of the session, students showed their designs altogether and clicked some beautiful pictures. The session ended with the filling of feedback forms and submission of work.



The School of Liberal Studies provides a course for its first-year students for which three sessions on the topic 'Disaster Management' were organized. 

#### DR. UDAYPRAKASH SHARMA






